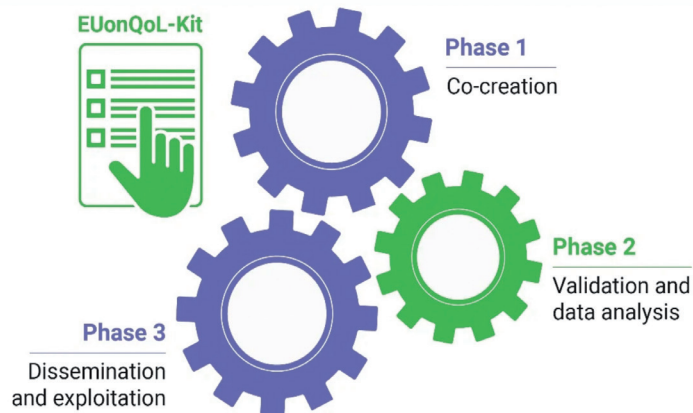
The EUonQoL-Kit



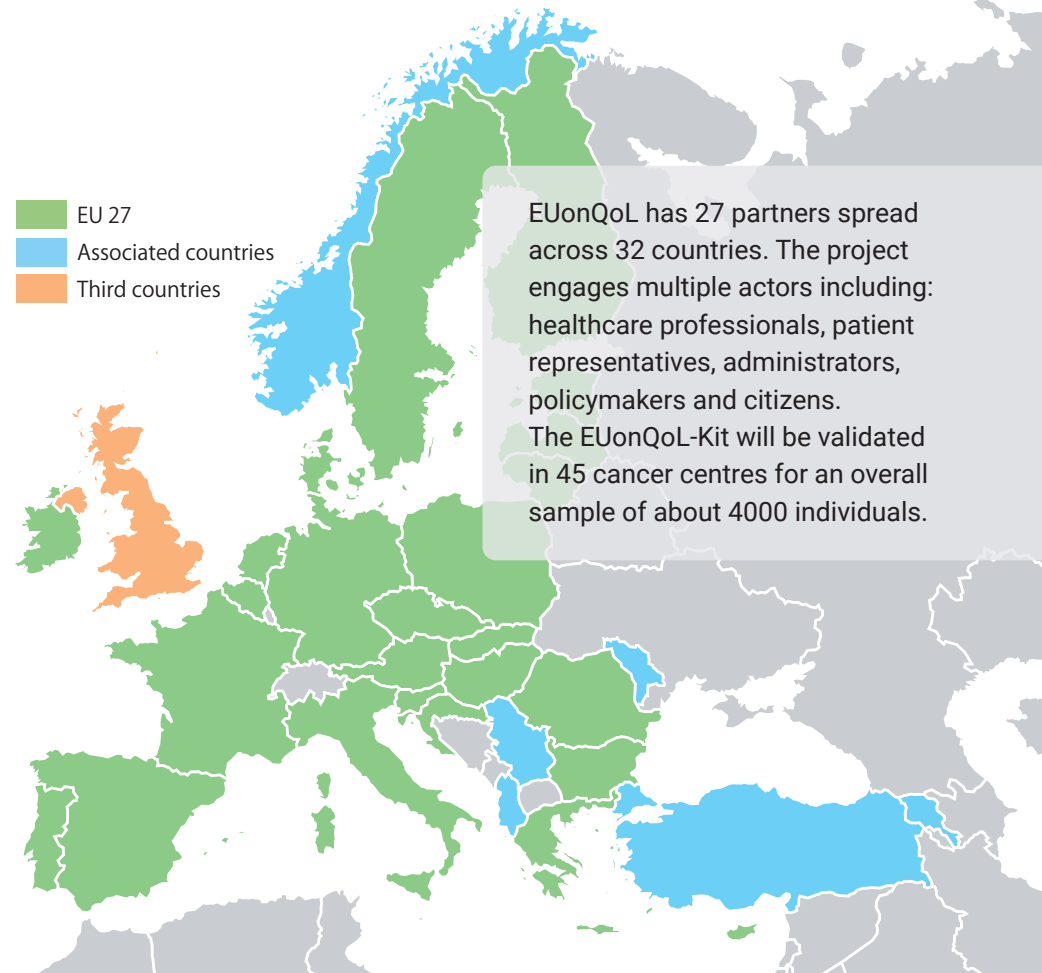
The EUonQoL-Kit consists of a set of questionnaires specifically designed to self-assess quality of life at different disease phases. It is characterized by innovative features:

- Co-designed with patients and stakeholders
- Available in 27 European languages
- Digitally administered by an app
- Tailored to patients' health condition

EUonQoL has 27 partners spread across 32 countries. The project engages multiple actors including: healthcare professionals, patient representatives, administrators, policymakers and citizens. The EUonQoL-Kit will be validated in 45 cancer centres for an overall sample of about 4000 individuals.
